## No Perfect Church... No Perfect Members

Every week the Presbyterian church not far from our home has a different saying on its sign next to a well-traveled street. Sometimes the sayings are serious, sometimes funny, often thought provoking. One in particular captured my attention recently. It said, "We are the perfect church for those who aren't."

How I love this message! We all have grand illusions about the "perfect church," don't we? The perfect church welcomes everyone, includes everyone, and values everyone. The perfect church lives in harmony, serves without regard to self,

and always looks outward in mission. The perfect church knows its Bible, honors one another, and forges ahead in ministry with one mind. You know what? I've never encountered such a church!

In fact, we do *not* welcome everyone, include everyone, or value everyone. Instead, we often shun, ignore, or devalue others. We do *not* live in harmony, serve selflessly, or look outward in mission. Instead, we frequently bicker, scheme to get our own way, and seek to limit what God might do through us. We regularly do *not* steep ourselves in the Word, or one another, or rally around God's call to be sent into the world. Instead, we too often let dust collect on our Bibles, thoughtlessly criticize others, and wrap our opinions in a robe of self-righteousness.

Those who are of the church ought to be the first to confess that we are not who God would wish us to be. There can be no claims of perfection because we are "in bondage to sin and cannot free ourselves."

Therefore, "We are the perfect church for those who aren't." To the guy who quips, "I'd never belong to a church because they're a bunch of hypocrites," we say, "Welcome, there's always room for one more!" Those who think the church ought to be "perfect" are bound to be sorely disappointed. Church isn't for those who are well and whole; it is for those broken, those sin-burdened, those who fall short...namely, you and me.

The Lord of forgiveness, peace, and reconciliation comes to we who are imperfect because we need the healing and new life that only our Savior provides. There is not perfect church because there are no perfect members in this body....only forgiven winners who lean upon and rejoice in the amazing grace of God. "We are the perfect church for those who aren't!"

The minimum goal is \$1.5 million, however, depending upon cost estimates the goal could be increased to meet the challenge.

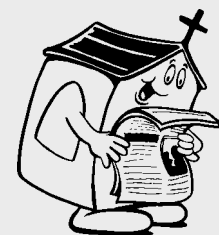
